Explanation of Examinee Statistics:

1. The Academic Bar Exam consists of the Uniform Bar Examination, which includes the Multistate Bar Examination (MBE), the Multistate Essay Examination (MEE) and the Multistate Performance Test (MPT).

2. Academic Bar Exam Passage represents statistics for those examinees who achieved a passing score of 260 or higher on the Academic Bar Exam for this administration of the exam.

3. <u>Certified</u> represents statistics for those examiness who sat for this administration of the Academic Bar Exam and who have satisfied all requirements for certification to the Alabama Supreme Court as admittees to the Alabama State Bar. In order to be certified to the Supreme Court as an admittee, an examinee must: (1) acheive a passing score of 260 or higher on the Academic Bar Exam; (2) achieve a score of 75 or higher on the Multistate Professional Responsibility Examination (MPRE) within the timeframe established by the *Rules Governing Admission to the Alabama State Bar*; and (3) complete the online course on Alabama law.
