In order to be certified to the Supreme Court as an admittee, an examinee must: (1) acheive a passing score of 260 or higher on the Academic Bar Exam; (2) achieve a score of 75 or higher on the Multistate Professional Responsibility Examination (MPRE) within the timeframe established by the *Rules Governing Admission to the Alabama State Bar*; and (3) complete the online course on Alabama law.
